PART - A

The outcome achieved of the Plan of action for 2010-2011.

- 1. To achieve this, preparation of SSR is underway, and the annual report of the College for 2010-2011 has been prepared.
- 2. Pressure has been made, and an initial instalment of Rs.342.46 lakhs has been released. As the construction work is to be done through some approved contractors in which the college authority has very little say, clearance of the site for the construction has been done.
- 3. An amount of Rs.5.00 lakhs was received from Dr L.Dath, Head, HRD Division, for renovation for teaching laboratories of the College. The same was spent for the purpose, it was sanctioned.

Regarding construction of standard Women's Hostel, construction work has not been resumed as no more instalment of the remaining fund is received following submission of the Utilization Certificate.

- 4. (i). Fund has been sought for purchasing Electronic Note-books for distribution among teaching staff for improvement and upgradation of teaching quality. For this, Zirsangliana Paite, Asst. Professor attended the Interface Meeting in Guwahati on 28thJan.2011, and submitted proposal of additional grant of Rs.25 lakhs.
 - (ii). Steps have been taken for obtaining stable broadband connection from private firm since the service of BSNL (now in use) is not reliable at all.
 - (iii). Funds have been sought for installing digital projectors in every classroom.
- 5. Reconstruction and reshuffling of sub- committee had not yet been done owing to some internal incongruity.
- 6. As of new measures for enhancement of quality of teaching in this college, circulars were served on emphasis of English in the course of classroom lectures thereby minimizing dictation of ready-made notes to encourage students to read as much and wide as possible.
- 7. As the college had no students of III BA in practical-bearing subjects, study our was not organised.
- 8. Besides the measure mentioned in Sl. No. 6, teaching staff were intimated to award justified and deserved marks to students who had the good knacks of reproducing their knowledge in their own style of writing especially in descriptive answers.
- 9. With the sanction of Grants-in-aid from UGC, Regional Office, Guwahati amounting to Rs. 5,500,000/-, 44(forty four) items of sports equipments were purchased from D.Light Enterprise, Aizawl.
- 10. As extension of Office building, a recreation centre measuring 104.5 sq.ft. was constructed (Assam type) for TV Grade Staff.
- 11. Provision of purified water could not be done owing to non-availability of fund...
- 12. Computerization of library services had not been completed..

PART - B

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution.

The goals and objectives may be put under two main heads: making and maintaining buildings/rooms to accommodate well students of various disciplines, and to give the kind of education to Students in line with the name of the department – Human Resources Development.

(a) Buildings:

- (i) Construction of Women's Hostel was started on 3.5.2010 under UGC fund, the first installment amounting to Rs.20,00,000/-, the Total estimate accepted being Rs.41,00,000/-, about 50% the work being done.
- (ii) Construction of Combined Additional Science Laboratory and Computer Laboratory. With the initial sanction of Rs.7,00,000/-, about half of the Construction has been done.
- (iii) Renovation have been done in Computer rooms
- (iv) Proposal and estimate for Major reconstruction of the main building (Class rooms) amounting to Rs.10.75 crores has been submitted and was earnestly be pursued to the Govt. of Mizoram.

Of the estimated amount of Rs.10.75 crores, Rs.951.29 lakhs has been approved and Rs.342.46 lakhs has been sanctioned as first installment.

- (v) With the sanction of Rs.5.00 lakhs from DST, Jorhat, renovation of sciences laboratories have been done for which the sanction was granted.
- (b) <u>Quality Education</u>; As the College situates in a remote corner of the Country, and as it has only one regular +2 level of education as its main feeder, students with low percentage of marks (weak students) it has to formulate special

means of teaching in order to enable the students pass the Examination and to have the resources of the students developed simultaneously.

For this, a special meeting of all teachers and students was organized in the month of June where lectures on (i) the need of quality education in this era of 'Survival of the fittest' again becomes the hard fact (ii) and on Career opportunities were given.

Again, special means of Screening Students was introduced in internal Examination to give awareness and need on discarding dawdling education.

Moreover, the college has prepared to meet the necessity of semester system of education to be started during 2010-2011 and newly formed Academic and Moderation Committees.

2. New <u>Academic</u> Programmes Initiated (UG)

As a first step, the College initiated and started BCA as a new Academic Programme in the under-graduate Courses of the College from the Academic year of 2009-2010. There are five(5) teaching staff and two(2) non-teaching staff. All the teaching staff are on temporary basis. No permanent and contract teachers have been provided by the Government of Mizoram. Out of the five teachers, three were appointed on part-time basis and their term of service ended on 30thNov. 2010. After December 2010, no teachers have been provided by the government on any basis till the reporting date. The salary of the teachers has been met from the college internal resources. However, the opening permission was obtained from the Govt. of Mizoram and the affiliation from Mizoram University.

3. Innovations <u>In Curricular Design</u> and Transaction.

As curricular design is done by the University, the College has no direct hand in this matter. However, thirteen teachers of this College have been Members of Board of Studies and of Schools where curricular design is done. (Detail being given under Citation Index of Faculty).

4 Inter-Disciplinary Programme started:

UGC Sponsored Coaching Class has started 1052 new books Costing Rs. 1,81,715/- were purchased for the Coaching Class. As no more fund was received, the class was not run during the reporting year.

University Examination Reforms are done by the University only. However, Internal Examination named Practice/Test Examination was done to Screen dawdling Students.
