PART - A

The outcome achieved of the Plan of Action for 2011-2012.

1. Distribution of Laptop (E-notebook): As mentioned in earlier AQAR, fund for this scheme was sought and interface meeting of UGC was also attended. Finally, UGC released this fund under the Additional Grant head and 40 laptops (E-notebook) were purchased and distributed among teaching and non-teaching faculty.

2. **Hosting of University Sports:** The University Sports Board decided to hold college football tournament at Champhai, and necessary arrangement for hosting this event was laid upon the institution. As such the college made the following arrangement –

3. **Construction of buildings:** Request has been made to the state government to hasten the much awaited construction of new buildings.

Permission for clearance of site for the upcoming new buildings has been obtained from the State Government and the following preparations were carried out as a consequence.

- a. Felling of trees and their disposal.
- b. Allocation of sites for Girls Hostel, Staff quarters, Boys hostel & Multipurpose Hall.
- c. Submission of required number of classrooms and laboratories for Arts, Sciences and B.C.A.
- 4. **Fund for more books:** The College has tried to acquire adequate books for academic purposes, however, due to scarcity of fund, books could be purchased only in bare requirement.
- 5. **Adequate teaching staff:** State government (through Directorate of H & TE) has been requested again and again to provide adequate teaching faculty for the college. However, desired result has not yet been achieved.
- 6. **To improve academic performance:** The academic result of the institution in the previous year was not satisfactory, hence methods are devised to improve the academic performance which is elaborate in Part-B section 1 (b) under Quality Education.
- 7. **Short course on computer concept:** Since laptops are distributed among teaching faculty in order to enhance ICT enabled learning and teaching, it is necessary to organize a short course on computer concept, details of which is described in Part-B section 7.
- 8. **Internet connection:** To have more stable and regular internet connection from BSNL, Champhai Circle, request has been made to SDO, BSNL, Champhai circle. The College and BSNL department organized a one day line checking and installment programme. Since the main problem is stolen telephone line every now and then, all

the lines in the prone area were undergrounded. It is hoped that the lines would be safe and sound from now on.

9. **Self Study Report and Re-Accreditation**: Self Study Report was prepared by Prof. Zirsangliana Paite, Assistant Coordinator, IQAC and LOI for re-accreditation was applied in the month of December, 2011. (This is valid because the college was first accredited in 2004 and after 5 years, 2 more years could be allotted for this preparation). However, it was replied by NAAC that a new format for SSR was to be in used and that the college may apply afresh for reaccreditation from March, 2012 onwards. Hence, re-accreditation process is put off for this year.

PART - B

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution.

The goals and objectives may be put under two main heads: making and maintaining buildings/rooms to accommodate students of various disciplines, and to give the kind of education to students in line with the name of the department – Human Resources Development.

(a) Buildings:

- (i) Construction of Women's Hostel, which was started on 3.5.2010 under UGC fund, the total estimate accepted being Rs.41,00,000/-, the first installment amounting to Rs.20,00,000/- has already been received in the preceding year, and the second installment of Rs 16,00,000/- is received this year, and about 80% the work is being finished.
- (ii) A sum of Rs 5,00,000/- (5 lakh only) was received from DST, New Delhi through NEIST, Jorhat for renovation of teaching laboratories. With this amount, sciences laboratories were upgraded, toilets constructed and seminar hall for practical classes was constructed. A water supply system connecting all the sciences laboratories was also established with one central water tanky.

(ii) Proposal and estimate for Major reconstruction of the main building (Class rooms) amounting to Rs.10.75 crores has been submitted and was earnestly be pursued to the Govt. of Mizoram.

Of the estimated amount of Rs.10.75 crores, Rs.951.29 lakhs has been approved, and work is being carried on from May, 2012. The buildings included are – Administrative & Library Buildings, Arts & Commerce Buildings, Sciences & Computer Sciences Buildings, Multipurpose Hall, Staff Quarters, Women hostel and Boys Hostels. The construction work is slated to be completed within 18 months.

(b) Quality Education;

In order to achieve academic excellence, the affiliating University viz., Mizoram University, has introduced semester system of education from the previous year. To pass on from annual to semester system, the academic committee of the college has chalked out various plans and actions.

- 1. <u>Academic Routine</u>: The committee prepared and listed out various academic routines such as date for internal examinations, date for submission of assignment, internal & university examinations invigilation schedule and preparation of college prospectus.
- 2. <u>Formation of different committees</u>:- In order to ensure improvement in academic performance and overall institutional activities, the following different committees are re-organised -

The term of tenure for each committee except IQAC is two years and

each committee is responsible for framing guidelines, action plan etc for its responsibilities. As such. Academic committee has been allotted the responsibility of smooth introduction of semester system.

The committee studied the implications of semester system and came out with detailed academic calendar and classroom distributions, classes distribution and guidelines for more effective teachings.

The curriculum committee was entrusted with designing and preparing class routine for all streams of studies viz., Arts, Sciences and B.C.A., and encompassing old courses of annual system and new courses of semester system.

2. New <u>Academic</u> Programmes Initiated (UG)

3. Innovations <u>In Curricular Design</u> and Transaction.

As curricular design is done by the University, the College has no direct hand in this matter. However, thirteen teachers of this College have been Members of Board of Studies and of Schools where curricular design is done.

5. <u>Examination</u> Reforms Implemented:

University Examination Reforms are done by the University only. However, Internal Examinations and assignments were given to the students to obtain internal marks, as per the University rules.

Course on Computer Concept was organized by Govt Champhai College in collaboration with DOEACC, Champhai Centre from **August – October 2011**.
